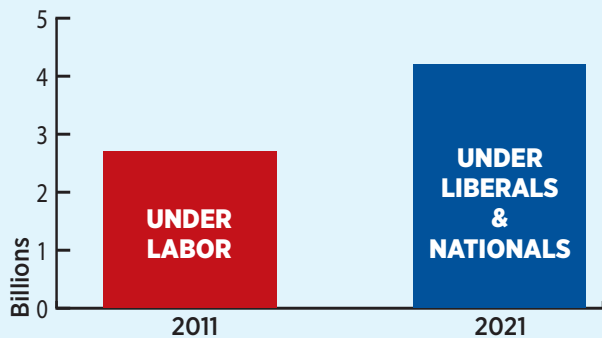


The NSW Police Force do an amazing job at responding to emergencies across our community 24/7 but they cannot respond if they don't know what is happening.

WHAT'S IN YOUR CAR?

MOST THEFTS ARE CRIMES OF OPPORTUNITY. THERE ARE MEASURES YOU CAN TAKE TO IMPROVE CAR SECURITY AND REDUCE THE RISK OF THEFT.

- **ALWAYS** keep your doors and windows locked when out of your car.
- **NEVER** leave valuables such as mobile phones, wallets, handbags or spare change in plain view - Even when parked at home.
- **ALWAYS** try to park in a well-lit or populated area.
- **TRADIES**, do you always lock your toolboxes and ute trays and try to avoid parking on the street at night?

Having your car broken into and your property stolen can be very inconvenient, costly and stressful. Don't tempt someone to break in.

GOING AWAY?

MAKE SURE YOUR HOME IS SAFE AND SECURE

- **ENSURE** the house is securely locked, including windows usually left open.
- **CANCEL** newspaper and **REDIRECT** your mail or have it collected by a friend.
- **PUT** pets into a boarding kennel or have friends visit them often.
- **TELL** neighbours or friends who can check on the house that you are away and whom will be at the house legitimately - e.g. gardeners, pet minders.
- **SECURE** your garage or, if unable - move items such as bikes inside the house.
- **CONSIDER** security devices, including CCTV, lights and timers etc.
- **DO NOT** leave cash in the house and locate jewellery in a safe place.
- **ENSURE** your lawn is cut, the property tidy and stop all deliveries.
- **AVOID** leaving the answering machine on and turn the phone volume down.

Received a call or text from
0444 444 444?
If you receive a call or SMS from the number above, it is genuine.

The message is from Emergency Alert, a national telephone warning system that sends voice messages to landlines and text messages to mobile phones in a defined area using geo-targeting technology.

The number may be used to advise about high risk missing persons and emergency situations such as fire, flood, or extreme weather events.

The NSW Police Force is now using geo-targeting to locate high risk missing persons, sending emergency alerts to mobiles in the area where the person went missing.

We remind you that if you receive a text message from **0444 444 444** this is an official alert to seek your assistance. This text will provide you with information and a link to an image.
